WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The following is to be published in verbatim in all schedules:

The following Code of Conduct was elaborated by the FEI for all people involved in the welfare of competing horses. The purpose is to ensure the health and welfare of horses participating under FEI Rules and Regulations and protecting the good image of the equestrian sport. To achieve the widest possible publicity it must be included in the **Schedules** and it is recommended that it also be included in the **Programmes** of all major international events.

CODE OF CONDUCT **FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. *At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.*
2. *Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.*
3. *Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.*
4. *Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.*
5. *The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.*

1. EVENTING MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS OF ATHLETES & HORSES (Art. 506) – Please include relevant part for level and category of event

Each NF must certify the minimum eligibility requirements of each horse and athlete and list the competitions which enabled horse and athlete to qualify, according to the qualification procedure established for each star level as laid out in Art. 506. Relevant level and criteria must be included in the schedule.

1.1. Principles

In order to compete at an international event, an athlete and horse must have obtained the minimum eligibility requirements at a number of events at a lower level.

The requirements are laid out below. With the approval of the FEI and their own NF, OCs may impose additional qualifications for horses and/or athletes, which must be published in the schedule.

1.2. Minimum eligibility requirements

The minimum eligibility requirements are achieved by completing a competition within minimum parameters of all round performance. As follows:

- Dressage Test: not more than 75 penalty points;
- Cross-Country Test:
 - From 2009 onwards, the results at obstacles at International events need to include, where applicable, a clear round (0 penalties) at obstacles for CICs events and maximum 20 penalties at a CCI.
 - Not more than 90 seconds exceeding the optimum time in the Cross. At 4* events, the maximum time by which the optimum time may be exceeded is 120 seconds; and
- Jumping Test: not more than 16 penalties at obstacles.

1.3. Certification of Qualification for Events

1.3.1. All NFs, including the host nation, are responsible to certify that athletes and horses entered by them in international events are correctly qualified in accordance with all the requirements of the Rules.

1.3.2. All qualifying events must be identified, and any national events must be certified as of at least the equivalent standard of difficulty as the relevant international star level of competition.

1.3.3. The Technical Delegate or his nominee shall check that all horses and athletes starting at all International events are properly certified as qualified by their NF or duly exempted in accordance with this article.

1.4. Qualifying Period and Deadline

1.4.1 Minimum eligibility requirements for CIOs, CCIs and CICs must be obtained in the calendar year in question or the 2 preceding calendar years.

1.4.2 The Minimum Eligibility Requirement at a CCI must be obtained at least 24 days before the Cross Country test of the event for which it is needed; a Minimum Eligibility Requirement at a CIC must be obtained at least 10 days before the event for which it is needed.

1.4.3 Minimum eligibility requirements may be achieved as a combination or separately by athlete and horse.

1.4.4 Where a Minimum Eligibility Requirement at a CIC is specified, one Minimum Eligibility Requirement at a CCI of the same level is equally acceptable.

3. VETERINARY ASPECTS / ISSUES

3.1 VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & "Rules for Eventing" **Art. 518.1 for CCIs and 518.2 for CICs.**

Art. 511.2.2

Every horse entered for any competition at CCNs, CICs 2/1* or CCIs 2/1* in a foreign country (GRs Art. 141.2), and all horses entered for CICs 3*, CCIs 4/3*, CCIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries, must have an official valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 511.2.3

Horses taking part in CCNs, CICs 2/1* or CCIs 2/1* in the country in which they are resident are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned Paragraph 2.2. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin, all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

NEW 3.2 EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VI (except events taking place in NZL & AUS) **UPDATE 1st SEPTEMBER 2009**

Please see FEI Veterinary Regulations **Annex VI** at www.fei.org.

3.3 SAMPLING PROCEDURE FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES (Vet. Regs, Ch. V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCIs 4/3*, CCIOs, World Cup™ Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CCIs/CICs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016).

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

3.4 MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge competitors the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

NEW 3.5 GROUPS I & II ONLY - MCP CENTRAL LABORATORY UPDATE 1st SEPTEMBER 2009

Under the Medication Control Programme (MCP) in **Groups I and II**, all samples collected in accordance with Vet. Regs. Art. 1016 will be analysed by the **Horseracing Forensic Laboratories (H.F.L) Sport Science, Quotient Bioresearch Limited Newmarket Road Fordham, Cambridgeshire CB7 5WW**. For events other than those listed in Vet. Regs. Art. 1016 or for events other than in Groups I and II, samples may be analysed at an alternative FEI listed laboratory (Vet. Regs. Art. 1021).

4. MISCELLANEOUS

4.1. OBJECTIONS/COMPLAINTS (Art. 166)

All complaints to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150 or equivalent.

4.2. DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY

Full details of any deductions from prize money must be outlined in the schedule. This includes

government taxes. If it is necessary for OCs to deduct such taxes, they must provide participants with an official form indicating the amount of tax deducted.

4.3 EVENTING MEDICAL CARD (Annex 7 "Rules for Eventing")

OCs must draw the attention of all competitors that they must carry readily accessible on themselves a medical card for the Cross-Country Test. Armbands must be checked by the OC upon arrival to the competition by the athletes and checked by the Official Doctor and the Technical Delegate for accurate information.

4.4. INSURANCES

Details pertaining to insurance of competitors, horses, etc

Responsibility of OC for damages, fire, theft, etc

The following is to be published **in verbatim** in all schedules:

"All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out a third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad and to keep the policy up to date".

4.5 EVENT'S ORGANISATION (Art. 114 & 115)

The OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. All modifications made to the schedule must have the approval of the FEI Secretary General.

4.6 ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS

OC to include details concerning right of entry to show-grounds of owners, grooms, athletes, other persons.

4.7 STABLE

Security and stewarding at International events, see Annex II of this Check List.

4.8 RESULTS

In order to proceed with the results publication for qualification purposes, the FEI requires results to be sent in immediately after the conclusion of the event. Please refer to compulsory format for CCIs and CICs. Results to be sent by e-mail to fabienne.diserens@fei.org, preferably on Excel file immediately after the event. All results must include FEI Passport Registration number of horses. **All athletes who have not completed the event must appear on the results sheets.** Exact distance of the Cross-country course must be included on result sheet.

STABLE SECURITY/STEWARDING AT INTERNATIONAL EVENTS
Minimum requirements to ensure implementation of Veterinary Regulations,
Art.1005.2 – SEE ALSO ANNEX 13 EVENTING RULES

1. ACCESS TO STABLE AREA

For an optimal stable security, the stables must be completely enclosed within a suitably restrictive perimeter (stable area) which will act both as a deterrent to the admission of unauthorised persons and to the exit of horses. The area must be sufficiently large to allow horses to be evacuated from the stables in an emergency but still remain within the confines of the perimeter. However, several disciplines allow in specific situations a lower level of stable security (see discipline rules).

Whenever possible the stable area must include only stables; lorries, caravans, etc., should not be permitted within the area unless specifically needed as accommodation for horses and/or grooms.

Access to stables must be limited to those persons indicated in VRs Art. 1005.2.5.2. It is essential that the official issuing authorised access be a responsible person of seniority within the OC.

2. CONTROL OF ACCESS

A control system must operate at all entrance gates so that there is an efficient and reliable method of identifying those who enter and leave the stable area at any time.

Extra vigilance must be used in establishing the identity of persons and reasons for entering the stables during the night.

3. STEWARDING OF STABLE AREA

At least one stable steward, directly responsible to the Chief Steward, must be present or readily available in the vicinity of the stable area 24 hours a day during the entire duration of the event. He may be assisted by deputies as required. The steward/deputies must regularly patrol the stable area, without establishing any predetermined pattern, to discourage any form of illegal practices or abuses to horses. Any misdemeanours must be reported immediately to the stable steward who must, in turn, report to the Chief Steward.

The duty of the stewards is therefore to safeguard the welfare of the horses and to prevent any form of illegal practices.

4. GROOMS

It is appreciated that grooms wish to remain with their horses during the night. Only grooms duly registered with the OC are permitted to do so.

The Person Responsible must ensure that his/her grooms, or any other authorised persons with access to his/her horses, are familiar with the security and stewarding procedures operating at the event attended.

5. MOVEMENT THROUGHOUT EVENT GROUNDS

Movement of horses between the stables, practice, grazing and main arena must be strictly controlled. The optimum layout for Jumping and Dressage disciplines is attached. It is appreciated that flexibility will be required depending on the requirements of other disciplines.

6. STEWARDING OF PRACTICE ARENA

The Chief Steward must ensure that all practice arenas are adequately stewarded all the time that they are officially open. He must also ensure that these arenas are subject to random control when they are officially closed.

7. GRAZING AREA

It is recommended that a grazing area be provided at all outdoor events, and that this be subject to random control. If available, horses must only be grazed or walked in hand within this area.

The Foreign Judge/TD at events will be specifically asked to check that the relevant requirements are met as reasonably as can be expected, depending on the discipline, and to indicate clearly any

shortfalls, following which consideration may be given to altering the category of the event in future.

Statute Alpine Championship for Eventing

1. Organizing Country

The event takes place in one of the five alpine countries (AUT, FRA, GER, ITA, SUI). If possible every 5th year in the same country.

2. Purpose

The Alpine Championship is a Team Event and open for all countries. It gives newcomers a chance to compete as a team member in a CCI** event according to FEI-Rules.

3. Participation of Competitors and Horses

There is only one team ranking in the CCI** and the following participation restrictions are only valid for the team members and not for riders and horses competing for individual ranking. Riders who competed in the current and the two preceding years at a championship (European, World, Olympic Games) or at a CCI**** are not allowed as team member.

Horses who competed during the current or the preceding two years at a championship (European, World, Olympic Games) or at a CCI**** or with rankings in the top 5 in a CCI*** are excluded from a team.

4. Organization

Should a country – whose turn it would be to organize the event – not be able to do it, the 4 remaining countries have the right to apply for it.

It is then the co-ordinator's (see 6) job to collect the applications and to decide about the further procedure.

At every event he will organize a meeting with the delegates of the participating countries in order to discuss possible measures to be taken, the further procedure and the date and place of the next event.

5. Prizes

The Alpine Cup is a challenge trophy and can be definitely won by a country if within 5 years it won the team event 3 times. In such a case the trophy has to be replaced by the winning country.

It is strongly recommended to award money prizes to make the Alpine Cup Event more attractive.

6. Ground Jury

If possible the 3 members of the ground jury should be composed as follows:

- One member from the country that organized the event in the previous year
- One member from the organizing country
- One member from the country that organize the event next year

The course designer of next year's event should automatically be invited by the organizer of the current year.

7. Co-ordinator

The co-ordinator is elected for an undetermined period by the representatives of the participating teams. His origin is one of the five alpine countries. He can retire at any time but doing so should take care to propose a successor.

8. Ratification

This statute replaces the one of 20.05.1994 and comes into 01.01.2000.

Begun again statute of the Alpine Cup (except item 6, Ground Jury, which is not valid any more).

Status Coupe des Alpes pour les Cavaliers du Concours Complet

a. Lieu de l'épreuve

La Coupe des Alpes a lieu chaque année si possible à raison d'un même pays (Allemagne, France, Autriche et Suisse) tous les cinq ans.

b. But

Le Championnat des Alpes est une épreuve d'équipe ouverte à tous les pays. Avec un taux de difficulté d'un examen CCI**, ce championnat permet aux cavaliers débutants de participer à cette épreuve internationale en tant que membre d'une équipe.

c. Restrictions de participation

Cette épreuve se déroulera selon les règles de CCI** en accord avec la FEI. Les différentes restrictions sont valables pour les cavaliers et leurs chevaux qui disputent le classement par équipe. Pour le classement individuel les règles de la FEI sont en vigueur. Il n'y a pas de deuxième classement en équipe à CCI** en dehors du classement d'équipe de la Coupe des Alpes

Les cavaliers en équipe ne peuvent pas prendre part à une épreuve en championnat (Européen, Mondiaux, Jeux Olympiques) ou à un CCI**** durant l'année présente et les deux années précédentes.

Les chevaux sont exclus du concours si ils ont pris part dans l'année présente et les deux années précédentes à un championnat (Européen, Mondiaux, Jeux Olympiques) ou à un CCI**** et si ils étaient classés au CCI*** du 1^{er} au 5^{ème} rang.

d. Organisation

Dans le cas où un des cinq pays désigné selon le rythme d'une fois tous les cinq ans ne serait pas en mesure d'organiser la Coupe des Alpes, les quatre autres pays auraient la possibilité de présenter leur revendication pour organiser le championnat.

Le coordinateur (voir § 6) reçoit les diverses requêtes et décidera des suites à donner.

Il réunira, lors de chaque épreuve, les délégués des pays participants pour discuter des éventuelles mesures à prendre et déterminer les lieux et dates du prochain championnat.

e. Prix

La Coupe des Alpes est un trophée de challenge pour l'équipe victorieuse qui récompense les trios meilleurs cavaliers. Pour devenir la possession d'un pays, il faut que le trophée soit gagné trios fois en cinq ans. Dans ce cas, le pays crée un nouveau trophée.

f. Groupe de juges

Ce groupe devrait si possible se composer de la manière suivante:

- un membre du pays qui a organisé l'épreuve l'année précédente
- un membre du pays organisateur
- un membre du pays qui a organisera l'épreuve l'année suivante

Le chef de piste du pays organisateur l'année suivante sera d'office invité par l'organisateur de l'année en cours.

g. Coordinateur

Ce dernier sera désigné par les délégués des équipes participantes pour une durée illimitée. Il devrait être originaire d'un des cinq pays alpins et peut démissionner à tout moment. En cas de démission, il devrait proposer un successeur.

h. Mise en vigueur

Ces statuts remplacent ceux dates du 20 mai 1994 et entrent en vigueur le 1er janvier 2000.
